


Original Survey was January 30, 1862 by William E. Daugherty. Original corner was a wooden post with bearing trees:

10" Hemlock N22°E, 6 lks. 10" Hemlock S40°E, 15 lks.

Descripton of corner evidence found:

We were unable to locate any evidence of corner in the area. We set a Bernsten Monument using single proportioning between the Northeast and the Southeast Section Corners and tied to 7/8" rebars with Lincoln County Caps.
