History of original corner establishment:

Date: April, 1852

Description of corner evidence found:

We searched at a North - South fenceline just north of the centerline of Heineman Road with a backhoe operated by Arnold Wyland Jr. We searched in this area due to testimony by Mrs. Tom Kennedy (life long resident of the property Northwest of the corner). We found a 7" x 7" x 30" granite stone with a scribed X on the top. The stone was tipped northeasterly, however the bottom looked to be in its original position. The stone was in line with the fenceline and about 4 feet north of the road centerline. Mrs. Kennedy had remembered buggies driving around the south side of the stone when she was a small girl, which is why she felt we'd find it North of the intersection.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.
