Original bearing trees: birch, 14", S28 E, 11 links; birch, 12", S16 W, 23 links; birch, 8", N77°W, 34 links, and a birch, N10°E, 7 links. with a backhoe and "found a 6" x 6" red granite monument upright and 17" below In 1979, Sheridan D. Schwark dug grade. The west side of the stone had a portion chipped out leaving a top of about 6" x 4". We (Schwark) set two 6" lincoln County Berntsen Extensions with a 2" Berntsen cap above the stone. The Berntsen is about 3" below grade". 11/05/96 D. Tlusty, D. Williams found 4" x 6" granite stone 3" below road surface. Found no evidence of the Berntsen as mentioned by Schwark. Used Schwarks ties to make chiseled "X" near the south edge of the top of the stone found. Remeasured to existing witness monuments as shown below.









