

02/04/1981 - S. Schwark, RLS-1205, found a 6" x 6" red Granite Stone Monument at an old broken down fence corner. The stone was heaved half way out and was leaning southerly. He reset the stone leaving the top .2' above grade and made reference ties to perpetuate the corner location.

03/07/2006 - K. Walkowski, PLS-2717, found the Granite Stone during a remonumentation project for Lincoln County, shown on Lincoln County Survey Office Map No. L423.

10/07/2014 - I Anthony R. Dallman, PLS-2405, found the 6" x 6" Granite Stone Monument of record, heaved ±18" above grade and leaning badly, in a wooded wet low area. Due to the possibility of further frost heave, I removed the Stone and set a 1" (o.d.) x 30" long drivable Aluminum Monument at the center of the hole remaining. This location was in general agreement with the overgrown bearing trees of the 1981 tie sheet. I left the Granite Monument lying on the ground along the northerly side of the Aluminum Monument and set new reference ties to perpetuate the corner location, as shown in the sketch below.


