Dug with power equipment and found a sharpened wooden stake circled by stones and accepted as at corner location after verifying this by traversing to adjacent Lincoln and Marathon corners. Set a Harrison Monument at the corner position and set 4 ties.

4/3/2019 I visited corner location and found all 4 ties in good condition. Area was blacktopped but didn't find any surface monument. Intersected ties and set an SMN-1 Nail at surface. Measurements to ties are as shown below.




