

Original Survey was January 30, 1862 by William E. Daugherty. Original corner was a wooden post with bearing trees:

8" White Pine N28E, 26 lks.

9" White Pine S43"W, 16 lks.

Corner was revisited by Genisot and Associates in February 1968 for Owens-Illinois. They set a squared post Marked S16, S15, S21and S22 and a 1-1/4" Iron Pipe (Kelly).

Corner was revisited again by William Kelly January 22, 1975. He set a Berntsen Monument and reset post and a Iron Pipe (set by Genisot) as witness Monuments and tied to bearing trees:



Descripton of corner evidence found:

We located a squared post marked S16, S15, S21 and S22, a Berntsen Monument and a 1-1/2" Iron Pipe, we accepted this position and tied to 7/8" rebar with Lincoln County Caps.
