Description of corner evidence found:

On February 2, 1978, we searched for the E 1/4 corner, Sec. 31, T32N, R7E. We found a down fence intersection running North, South, East, and West. We found down fence and posts to establish as best as possible the direction of the fence lines. We also went West across the Prairie River and found a continuation of the fence running West. A large rotted off post was found which appeared to be at the fence intersection. We set a 1 1/4" x 30" solid round iron rod at a point we determined to be the E 1/4 corner, after searching the intersection for any evidence of a existing corner. The corner we set fit all the fence lines well.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

We replaced the 1 1/4" rod with a Lincoln County Berntsen monument having the following witness monuments:

5" Elm N15°E, 12.03'
7" Elm East, 18.85'

1" iron pipe, S15°W, 5.25'
1" iron pipe, West, 21.40'
