Describe record evidence, recovered physical evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence and all other evidence considered in the recovery/restoration of the corner.

The original corner was established in 1851 by James M. Marsh. Original bearing trees: hemlock, 12", S10°E, 42 lks., and a sugar, 10", N70°W, 28 lks. In July, 1918, W.C. Webly set a stone with "+" and surveyed the 1/4 line to the East. In 1921, Malcolm Hutchinson surveyed the 1/4 line to the East, but didn't describe this corner. In 1981, former surveyor Wm. Kelly found 6" x 6" granite stone for the corner. He replaced it with a 2" x 18" iron and set 1 1/2" iron pipe witness monuments 33' E & W of the corner. 11/08/99 Dave Tlusty, Dean Williams found the 2" iron pipe down 0.7' in the road and found one Kelly witness monument to the West in good condition. Accepted the 2" iron pipe found as the best evidence of the corner location and perpetuated it as shown below.
