

Hoglund, S-1910, searched for the corner and found no evidence. We did not dig for this because the corner fell in a cut area and there are existing underground utilities at the corner location which would have destroyed any evidence of the corner. We set a Lincoln County Berntsen Aluminum Monument on an extention of the centerline of Chase Hill Drive from the West with an existing fence line running North-South. (Note: Chase Hill Drive make a turn in the road near the existing driveways shown below, but is straight from the driveways back toward the West.) We set new witness corners as shown below. (c)(d)(e) Plan view of corner with ties to at least 4 witness monuments.
