Description of corner evidence found: The corner location was destroyed when a new bridge was constructed over the North Branch of the Prairie River. Clarence Montabon who operated the road grater for the Town of Russell for many years, remembers seeing a portion of the granite monument (the section corner) while the new bridge was under construction. Using his witness that the corner was in a westerly extention of the centreline of Prairie Forks Drive and using a 1" iron rebar (approximate Northwest corner of Volume 245 at page 197), we measured Easterly the called distance of 400.00' and place the corner at the intersection of these two references.
