

In a 1937 survey by Francis Fox, set stone at edge of swamp (proportion measurement) and witnessed by pine 7 S 64° E 18.6 links and pine stump 17 N 40° W 134.09 links. I found the red granite in black spruce-tamarack swamp. Set new witnesses as shown below.
