According to 80 year old local resident Mr. Ohlmann, a grader had destroyed the 1903 granite monument. He said that he put a wooden lath in the stone's position when it was destroyed. He also showed Schwark a 6" x 6" x 19" portion of the granite monument which was lying in the ditch since the time it was destroyed. Schwark excavated further and found no evidence of the stone monument. He accepted the found iron pipe as the corner and set a Lincoln County Berntsen Monument in it's position. We found a bent 1 1/2" x 14" iron pipe in the roadway. Mr. Ohlmann, 80 year old local resident, informed us that a grader had destroyed the granite monument that was set in 1903 by Louis Kleinschmidt. He said that he put a wooden lath in the stones position when it was destroyed. He also showed us a 6" x 6" x 19" portion of the granite monument which was lying in the dith and had been there since it was destroyed. That portion appeared to be the base portion. We excavated the roadway with a backhoe and found no evidence of the wooden lath or any remains of the granite monument. Therefore, we accepted the iron pipe as the corner and set a Lincoln County Berntsen Monument Description of monument and accessories Lestablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner. in its position.
